Our last newsletter was in the run up to Advent, so we had a busy season of Christmas events, including a festive coffee morning with a few pop-up stalls, and a lovely number of villagers. Our carol service was a magical evening, telling the story of Christmas through readings and carols, and followed by nibbles and mulled wine. The church was full and there was a lovely atmosphere (and the warm scent of mulled spices).... We ended the Advent season with Midnight Mass. In a packed church, we were delighted to have Anjali Kanagaratnam with us as she took her first Midnight Service, surrounded by friends and family - a very special moment.

During the late winter, there have been **some significant repair works carried out in the church**, but done so cleverly that they can't be seen! Our very brave and talented master carpenter repaired the roof over the doorway

at the very top of the bell tower, not an easy task. He then moved on to the wooden panelling which has been carefully repaired along the southern wall. A number of pews have had hidden supports added beneath the wooden flooring, as they were in a poor state. St. Andrew's was then offered the opportunity of a **beautiful baby grand piano**, and in honour of its' arrival, a whole section of staging was re-built to support its' weight. Our thanks to Guy Wood for all his efforts and clever repairs. The piano has now arrived, is being tuned, and will be ready to grace us through future services and concerts.



We are now in Lent, and although it is a quiet and reflective time, there is still much going on in the life of St. Andrew's. Lent is a time when we particularly think of the

needs of others, and of those who are suffering great hardship and need. We are particularly thinking of the devastating earthquake in Turkey and Syria, and the overwhelming task facing aid agencies there. We are directly collecting donations in the church, and on **Wednesday 22nd March, we will be holding our Lent Lunch** in aid of this appeal. We offer a simple lunch in the Village Hall with a delicious selection of soup, bread and coffee. This is a lovely and well-supported community event, bringing people together to eat and to chat; at the same time, we will raise vital funds for the Disasters Emergency Committee Appeal in support of Turkey and Syria.

We have welcomed record numbers of visitors to St Andrew's over the last year to enjoy the peace within the building together with the wealth of historic interest.
