THE CHURCHYARD

As the summer season faded, we had the long grass in the rear churchyard cut for the first time this year. Leaving the wildflowers and grasses to grow all summer provides a varied and sheltered habitat for wildlife and allows it all to set seed. This late cut and removal of the grass ensures that there is an opportunity for that seed to fall - and importantly that there is no enrichment of the soil through the clippings. This gentle and organic management preserves an environment that has been remarkably untouched for potentially hundreds of years.

Our garden bank, dividing the upper and lower churchyard, has been a great success in its second year. Many of the plants have fully established and it is currently covered in bees feeding on all the pink sedum flowers, which are also useful for our flower arrangements. We are very happy to receive donations of any spare (and fairly hardy) plants for this bank, and we hope it will continue to flourish.
