<u>RAISING THE ROOF!!!</u> – Southern Slopes Project.



In 2016, after many years of fundraising and growing concern over water damage, the north side of St. Andrew's was re-roofed, at a cost of about £120k. This side was chosen as it was in the poorest condition; however, we have known for some years that the entirety of the roof needs replacing. Inevitably, further deterioration has taken place of the other slopes – just how much will become evident in the 5 yearly inspection of the structure taking place imminently – and we can delay no longer in re-roofing them.

The logistical issues in the work to the northern side were considerable; the south facing aspect, which will include the porch and all the 'village-facing" roofs, is going to be a formidable challenge. We already know that we will need in excess of £330,000 to complete these works.

We plan to start as soon as practicable in spring 2025 – it is necessary with all the logistics, securing of permissions and engaging contractors, to plan ahead and fix on a timetable. We have some funds to make a start and we will apply for any available grants, but clearly we have a massive hill to climb.
