### **Raise the Roof:- Southern and Eastern Slopes Project.**

A Major challenge lies ahead – the complete re-roofing of the southern slopes of the church, including the porch and eastern end of the church. We have launched the "Raise the Roof" campaign, and plan to start work in spring 2025 – which is going to be a significant financial and logistical challenge. The work has now gone out to tender and we hope to finalise a contractor in the coming weeks.

We are obviously looking at all grants that might be available, but St Andrew's is responsible for raising every penny of the £330,000 that it is forecast to cost. It is going to

be a huge effort to raise this money, but vital to keep our church at the heart of the village and safe for the generations to come. Please support us in whatever way you can; every penny we raise will make a difference. Our first fund raising effort is the musical weekend at the end of June.
