Remembrance Service. On Sunday 9th November, we will be joined by a contingent of The Royal Corps of Signals from Azimghur Barracks at Colerne, as we remember The Fallen. The service starts promptly at 10.50 am by the War Memorial with the Act of Remembrance, followed by a church service inside. This is always a very significant service for our community. A collection is taken for the work of the Royal British Legion.





Festive Coffee morning. Join us in St. Andrew's on Wednesday 10th December for a merry coffee morning of cake and mince pies, and maybe a glass of mulled wine, as we welcome in the Christmas period.

Eco Church. We have been thrilled to entertain a family of hedgehogs over the late spring and summer. Despite all the noise and disruption of the roof work, they have made the churchyard their home - encouraged, we think, by the longer grass and cool foraging which the grounds provided in the baking hot summer. Hilary Baker has fed them every night since they arrived, and 3 new hog houses have been placed in the churchyard to add to the one she has already provided. We hope the family will hibernate with us and we'll see them again in the spring. Swift pockets have been installed in the new roof, and we very much hope they will make use of them for nesting next summer. The annual mow of the longer grass areas has very carefully taken place, during which the shed skin of a grass snake was discovered! All these are excellent signs of the health of the churchyard and the precious sanctuary that it offers to wildlife.
